## Accountant

- Examine and analyze journal and ledger entries, bank statements, inventories, expenditures, tax returns and other accounting and financial records, documents and systems of individuals, departments within organizations, businesses or other establishments to ensure financial recording accuracy and compliance with established accounting standards, procedures and internal controls.
  - Prepare detailed reports on audit findings and make recommendations to improve individual or establishment's accounting and management practices.

## Actor

- Study and rehearse lines, gestures and expressions to interpret a role.
  - Portray roles in video or motion picture productions, television shows, theatre productions, radio dramas, commercials and other productions or perform the narration.

## Administrative Assistant

- Prepare, key in, edit and proofread correspondence, invoices, presentations, brochures, publications, reports and related material from machine dictation and handwritten copy.
  - Open and distribute incoming regular and electronic mail and other material and co-ordinate the flow of information internally and with other departments and organizations.

## Agriculture and Aquaculture Inspector

- Fish and fish products inspectors inspect fish, fish products, fish handling and processing methods and prepare reports and ensure that regulations are followed.
- Fruit and vegetables inspectors inspect fresh and frozen fruit and vegetables at inspection centres and prepare reports on crop production and market conditions.



## Air Traffic Controller

- Control flow of air traffic within assigned airspace using radar monitors, radio and other communication equipment and visual references.
- Issue aircraft takeoff and landing instructions to pilots and relay meteorological, navigational and other information to pilots in flight.



## Architect

- Consult with clients to determine the type, style and purpose of renovations or new building construction being considered.
- Conceptualize and design buildings and develop plans describing design specifications, building materials, costs and construction schedules.



## Artist

- Carvers use hand tools and woodworking machines to produce carvings from wood, stone and other materials and to carve ornamental designs into wooden furniture and other objects.
  - Glass blowers design and create glass objects using blowpipes and artisan's hand tools and equipment.

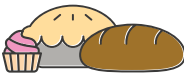
## Athlete

- Train under the direction of a coach or trainer to qualify for competition.
- Attend scheduled practice and training sessions.



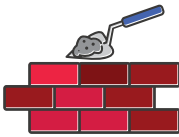
## Author

- Conceive and write novels, plays, scripts, poetry and other material for publication or presentation.
- May conduct research to establish factual content and to obtain other necessary information.



## Baker

- Prepare dough for pies, bread, rolls and sweet goods, batters for muffins, cookies and cakes and icings and frostings according to recipes or special customer orders.
- Bake mixed doughs and batters.



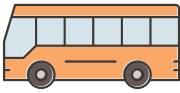
## Bricklayer

- Read sketches and blueprints to calculate materials required
- Cut and trim bricks and concrete blocks to specification using hand and power tools



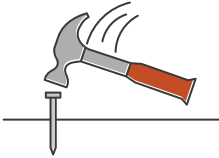
## Broadcaster

- Select and introduce music, videos and other entertainment material for broadcast, and make commercial and public service announcements.
- Act as host/hostess or master of ceremonies, introduce and interview guests and conduct proceedings of shows or programs.



## Bus Driver

- Drive buses or streetcars to transport passengers along established routes to local destinations.
- Drive buses to transport passengers and goods to intercity or long distance destinations.



## Carpenter

- Read and interpret blueprints, drawings and sketches to determine specifications and calculate requirements.
- Prepare layouts in conformance to building codes, using measuring tools.



## Chef

- Plan and direct food preparation and cooking activities of several restaurants in an establishment, restaurant chains, hospitals or other establishments with food services.
- Consult with clients regarding weddings, banquets and specialty functions.



## Coach

- Identify strengths and weaknesses of athletes or teams.
- Plan, develop and implement training and practice sessions.



## Computer Programmer

- Write, modify, integrate and test software code.
- Maintain existing computer programs by making modifications as required.



## Computer Technician

- Maintain, troubleshoot, repair and administer local area networks (LANs), wide area networks (WANs), mainframe networks, computer workstations, connections to the Internet and peripheral equipment.
- Evaluate and install computer hardware, networking software, operating system software and software applications.



## Conservation and Fishery Officer

- Generate public awareness of fish and wildlife conservation and regulations.
- Conduct patrols by truck, aircraft, boat, or on foot, to ensure compliance with the provincial and federal statutes relating to fish, wildlife and the environment.



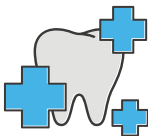
## Correctional Service Officer

- Observe conduct and behaviour of offenders and detainees to prevent disturbances and escapes.
- Supervise offenders during work assignments, meals and recreation periods.



## Customer Service Representative

- Answer, in person or on the phone, enquiries from customers.
- Investigate complaints regarding the establishment's goods, services and policies.



## Dentist

- Examine patients' teeth, gums and surrounding tissue to diagnose disease, injury and decay and plan appropriate treatment.
- Restore, extract and replace diseased and decayed teeth.



## Dietician

- Develop, administer and supervise nutrition and food preparation and service programs in hospitals, nursing homes, schools, company cafeterias or similar settings.
- Provide nutrition guidance, label interpretation and consultation services to health professionals, individuals, dietetic interns, community groups, government and the media.



## Dispatcher

- Receive requests for emergency assistance or service and contact ambulances, police and fire departments, tow-trucks, and utility crews.
- Process and transmit information and instructions to co-ordinate the activities of vehicle operators, crews and equipment using a variety of computer-aided communications and dispatching equipment.



## Doctor

- Examine patients and take their histories, order laboratory tests, X-rays and other diagnostic procedures and consult with other medical practitioners to evaluate patients' physical and mental health.
  - Prescribe and administer medications and treatments.

## Early Childhood Educator

- Develop and implement child-care programs that support and promote the physical, cognitive, emotional and social development of children.
- Lead activities by telling or reading stories, teaching songs, taking children to local points of interest and providing opportunities to express creativity through the media of art, dramatic play, music and physical activity.

## Economist

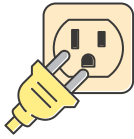
- Conduct research and develop models to analyze, explain and forecast economic behaviour and patterns, and devise methods for collection and analysis of data.
- Forecast production and consumption of specific products and services based on records of past production and consumption and general economic and industry-specific conditions.

## Educational Counsellor

- Counsel students regarding educational issues such as course and program selection, time tables and scheduling, school adjustment, attendance problems and study skills.
  - Counsel students regarding career or vocational issues including career exploration and planning, résumé preparation, job interview skills and job search strategies and make available to them a wide range of educational and occupational information.

## Electrician

- Read and interpret drawings, circuit diagrams and electrical code specifications to determine wiring layouts for new or existing installations
- Pull wire through conduits and through holes in walls and floors



## Engineer

- Confer with clients and other members of the engineering team and conduct research to determine project requirements.
- Plan and design major projects.



## Farmer

- Manage the overall operations of a farm, ranch or orchard.
- Determine the amount and kinds of crops to be grown and livestock to be raised.



## Financial Investor

- Evaluate financial risks, prepare financial forecasts, financing scenarios and other documents concerning capital management, and write reports and recommendations.
- Plan short- and long-term cash flows and assess financial performance.



## Firefighter

- Respond to fire alarms and other calls for assistance, such as automobile and industrial accidents, bomb threats and other emergencies.
- Rescue victims from burning buildings and accident sites.



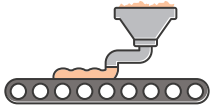
## Fisherman/Woman

- Operate fishing vessel to pursue and catch fish and other marine life.
- Select area for fishing, plot courses and compute navigational positions using compasses and charts or electronic fishing aids.



## Flight/Ship Attendant

- Greet passengers, explain and demonstrate safety procedures, check the general condition of the aircraft cabin, ensure that all necessary supplies are on board.
- Attend to safety of passengers during take-offs, landings and emergencies.



## Food Production Worker

- Transport raw materials, finished products and packaging materials throughout plant and warehouse manually, or with powered equipment.
- Measure and dump ingredients into hoppers of mixing and grinding machines or mobile tank trucks.



## Food and Beverage Server

- Greet patrons, present menus, make recommendations and answer questions regarding food and beverages.
- Take orders and relay to kitchen and bar staff.



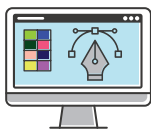
## Forestry Worker

- Assess site, select seedlings and plant trees using manual planting tools in reforestation areas.
- Operate power thinning saw to thin and space trees in reforestation areas.



## Funeral Director

- Consult with the family of the deceased regarding the nature of the funeral service, the disposition of the remains and funeral costs.
- Transfer, or arrange for the transfer of, the remains from the place of death to the funeral home.



## Graphic Designer

- Consult with clients to establish the overall look, graphic elements and content of communications materials in order to meet their needs
- Determine the medium best suited to produce the desired visual effect and the most appropriate vehicle for communication



## Hairstylist/Barber

- Suggest hair style compatible with client's physical features or determine style from client's instructions and preferences.
- Cut, trim, taper, curl, wave, perm and style hair.



## Health and Safety Inspector

- Inspect the sanitary conditions of restaurants, hotels, schools, hospitals and other public facilities or institutions.
- Conduct surveys and monitoring programs of the natural environment to identify sources of pollution.



## Heavy Equipment Operator

- Operate heavy equipment such as backhoes, bulldozers, loaders and graders to excavate, move, load and grade earth, rock, gravel or other materials during construction and related activities.
- Operate bulldozers or other heavy equipment to clear brush and stumps prior to logging activities and to build roads at logging and surface mining sites.



## Human Resources Professional

- Plan, develop, implement and evaluate human resources and labour relations strategies including policies, programs and procedures to address an organization's human resource requirements.
- Advise employers and employees on the interpretation of human resources policies, compensation and benefit programs and collective agreements.



## Information Systems Analyst

- Confer with clients to identify and document requirements.
- Conduct business and technical studies.



## Interior Designer

- Consult with clients to determine needs, preferences, safety requirements and purpose of space.
- Develop detailed plans and 3-D models showing arrangement of walls, dividers, displays, lighting and other fixtures using computer-assisted design (CAD) software and graphics software.



## Janitor

- Operate industrial vacuum cleaners to remove scraps, dirt, heavy debris and other refuse.
- Wash windows, interior walls and ceilings.



## Journalist

- Collect local, national and international news through interviews, investigation and observation.
- Write news stories for publication and broadcast.



## Judge

- Preside over courts of law, interpret and enforce rules of procedure and make rulings regarding the admissibility of evidence.
- Instruct the jury on laws that are applicable to the case.



## Landscaper

- Arborists and tree service technicians examine trees and shrubs to diagnose problems and disease, and apply various treatments such as pruning, spraying, repairing damaged areas and injecting with treatment solutions.
- Golf course superintendents direct crews who maintain the health and appearance of golf courses and their surrounding landscapes, plant and move trees, and apply fertilizers, fungicides, herbicides and pesticides.



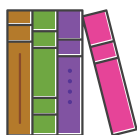
## Labourer

- Load and unload construction materials, and move materials to work areas.
- Erect and dismantle concrete forms, scaffolding, ramps, catwalks, shoring and barricades required at construction sites.



## Lawyer

- Advise clients of their legal rights and all matters related to law.
- Research legal precedents and gather evidence.



## Librarian

- Recommend acquisition of books, periodicals and audio-visual, interactive media and other materials for inclusion in library collection.
- Provide reference services.



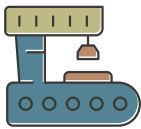
## Logging Machine Operator

- Cable yarding system operators operate machines to transport trees from logging areas to landing or log loading sites in mountainous terrain in western Canada.
  - Mechanical harvester and forwarder operators assess site and terrain and drive heavy equipment to perform a combination of felling, slashing, bucking, bunching and forwarding operations at logging areas.

## Longshore Worker

- Operate industrial trucks, tractors and other mobile equipment to transfer cargo, such as containers, crated items, automobiles and pallet-mounted machinery, around dock to within range of cranes and hoists.
- Operate winches or other hoisting devices to load and unload cargo onto and from ships and other vessels.



## Machinist

- Read and interpret engineering drawings, blueprints, charts and tables or study sample parts to determine machining operation to be performed, and plan best sequence of operations.
- Compute dimensions and tolerances and measure and lay out work pieces.



## Mathematician

- Conduct research to extend mathematical knowledge in traditional areas of mathematics such as algebra, geometry, probability and logic
- Apply mathematical techniques to the solution of problems in scientific fields such as physical science, engineering, computer science or other fields such as operations research, business or management.



## Mechanic

- Review work orders and discuss work with supervisor.
- Inspect motor in operation, road test motor vehicle, and test automotive systems and components using computerized diagnostic and other testing devices to diagnose and isolate faults.





## Medical Technologist

- Set up, operate and maintain laboratory equipment.
- Conduct and interpret chemical analyses of blood, urine, and cerebrospinal and other body fluids.



## Meteorologist

- Observes, records, and reports weather information like air pressure, temperature, and precipitation.
- Installs, inspects, monitors, and maintains meteorological equipment.



## Military Officer

- The Canadian Forces include many occupations that are not all combat-related. With many opportunities to earn money while training.
- Health care, skilled trades, engineering, and information technology are just a few of the many opportunities available.



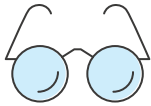
## Musician

- Musicians play one or more instruments as soloists or as members of a musical group before audiences or for recording purposes.
- Singers sing musical arrangements as soloists or as members of vocal groups before audiences or for recording purposes.



## Nurse

- Assess patients to identify appropriate nursing interventions.
- Collaborate with members of an interdisciplinary health team to plan, implement, co-ordinate and evaluate patient care in consultation with patients and their families.



## Optometrist

- Examine patients' eyes, conduct tests and use ophthalmoscopes, biomicroscopes and other specialized instruments to determine ocular health and visual efficiency.
- Prescribe and provide treatment (excluding surgery) to maintain, improve and correct vision and manage other ocular diseases and disorders.



## Paramedic

- Assess extent of injuries or medical illnesses of trauma victims, patients with respiratory disease and stress, overdose and poisoning victims, industrial accident victims and other ill or injured individuals to determine emergency medical treatment.
- Administer pre-hospital emergency care to patients such as oxygen therapy, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), spinal immobilization, bandaging and splinting.



## Personal Support Worker

- Provide care and companionship for individuals and families during periods of incapacitation, convalescence or family disruption.
- Administer bedside and personal care to clients such as aid in ambulation, bathing, personal hygiene, and dressing and undressing.



## Pharmacist

- Check prescriptions for proper dosage.
  - Compound prescribed pharmaceutical products by calculating, measuring and mixing the quantities of drugs and other ingredients required and filling appropriate containers with correct quantity.

## Photographer

- Study requirements of a particular assignment and decide on type of camera, film, lighting and background accessories to be used.
- Determine picture composition, make technical adjustments to equipment and photograph subject.



## Physiotherapist

- Assess patients' physical abilities through evaluative procedures such as functional ability tests.
- Establish treatment goals with patients based on physical diagnoses.



## Pilot

- Conduct pre-flight inspection of aircraft and check passenger and cargo distribution to ensure that weight and balance specifications are met.
- Co-ordinate flight activities with ground crews and air-traffic control, inform crew members of flight and test procedures and direct activities of aircraft crew during flights.



## Plumber

- Read blueprints, drawings and specifications to determine layout of plumbing system, water supply network and waste and drainage systems.
- Install, repair and maintain domestic, commercial or industrial plumbing fixtures and systems.



## Police Officer

- Patrol assigned areas to maintain public safety and order and to enforce laws and regulations.
- Investigate crimes and accidents, execute search warrants, secure evidence, interview witnesses, compile notes and reports and provide testimony in courts of law.



## Politician

- Creates laws and policies that protect and support people living in their communities.
- Approves funding for projects that improve the economy, provide jobs and grow communities.



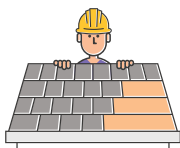
## Real Estate Agent

- Solicit property sales listings from prospective vendors.
- Assist vendors in selling property by establishing asking price, advertising the property, listing the property with listing services and conducting open houses for prospective buyers.



## Retail Salesperson

- Greet customers and discuss type, quality and quantity of merchandise or services sought for purchase, rental or lease.
- Advise customers on use and care of merchandise, and provide advice concerning specialized products or services.



## Roofer

- Install, repair or replace built-up roofing systems using materials such as asphalt saturated felts and hot asphalt and gravel.
- Install, repair or replace single-ply roofing system using waterproof sheet materials such as modified plastics, elastomeric or other asphaltic compositions.



## School Teacher

- Prepare subject material for presentation to students according to an approved curriculum.
- Teach students using a systematic plan of lectures, discussions, audio-visual presentations, and laboratory, shop and field studies.



## Scientist

- Plan and conduct studies of the environment, and of the population, distribution, structure and functional characteristics and behaviour of plants and animals.
- Conduct ecological and environmental impact studies and prepare reports.



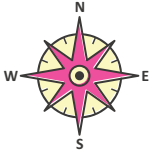
## Social Worker

- Interview clients individually, in families, or in groups, to assess their situation and problems and determine the types of services required.
- Provide counsel and therapy to assist clients in developing skills to deal with and resolve their social and personal problems.



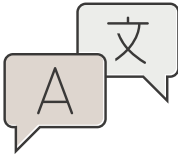
## Therapist

- Assess patients and review reports from physicians, physiotherapists, psychiatrists, counsellors, teachers and other professionals to determine patients' current and potential functioning level.



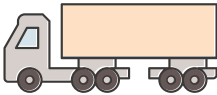
## Tour Guide

- Tour and travel guides escort individuals and groups on trips, on sightseeing tours of cities and on tours of historical sites and establishments such as famous buildings, manufacturing plants, cathedrals and theme parks.



## Translator

- Translate a variety of written material such as correspondence, reports, legal documents, technical specifications and textbooks from one language to another, maintaining the content, context and style of the original material to the greatest extent possible.
- Localize software and accompanying technical documents to adapt them to another language and culture.



## Transport Truck Driver

- Operate and drive primarily tractor-trailer, long-combination vehicle and straight-body trucks weighing over 4500 kg to transport goods and materials over long distances.
- Plan trip logistics and obtain required documentation to transport goods.

## University Professor

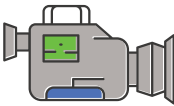
- each one or more university subjects to undergraduate and graduate students.

- Treat sick or injured animals by prescribing medication, setting bones, dressing wounds or performing surgery.

## Videographer

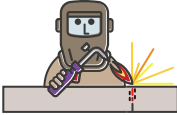
- Adjust focus, exposure, lighting, and other camera settings.

## Web Designer

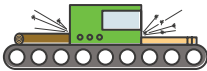
- Consult with clients to develop and document Web site requirements.
- Prepare mock-ups and storyboards.

## Welder

- Read and interpret blueprints or welding process specifications.
- Operate manual or semi-automatic welding equipment to fuse metal segments using processes such as gas tungsten arc welding (GTAW), gas metal arc welding (GMAW), flux-cored arc welding (FCAW), plasma arc welding (PAW), shielded metal arc welding (SMAW), oxy-acetylene welding (OAW), resistance welding and submerged arc welding (SAW).

## Wood Processing Machine Operator

- Operate and tend various wood processing equipment and machines to remove bark, knots and dirt from logs; reduce logs or sawmill waste into wood chips or flakes; stack and band lumber; screen wood chips; and produce waferboards, particleboards, hardboards and insulation boards
- Operate and tend conveyors, lathes, sanding machines and other equipment to peel and slice veneer from logs and log sections, and to glue, press, trim, sand and splice veneer sheets.



# Characteristic Cards

<b>9 AM to 5 PM Work Week</b>	Traditional daily work hours that result in a 40-hour work week.
<b>Abstract Learning</b>	The ability to learn about things that are beyond what a person can see, touch, feel, hear and taste. Complex thought.
<b>Acceptance of People Different From You</b>	Understanding that everyone is unique and not treating others negatively based on how they look or their beliefs, identity, sex or gender.
<b>Accountable</b>	To be responsible and accepting of the outcomes of one's decisions, actions or behaviors.
<b>Accounting</b>	The management of money or the process of keeping financial accounts.
<b>Achievement</b>	A thing done successfully, typically by effort, courage, or skill.
<b>Adaptability</b>	The quality of being able to adjust to new conditions.
<b>Advertising</b>	The activity or profession of producing advertisements for commercial products or services.
<b>Advocating for Self and Others</b>	The ability to speak up and fight back when a person (or others) are being unfairly treated.
<b>Ambitious</b>	Having or showing a strong desire and determination to succeed.
<b>Approachable</b>	Friendly and easy to talk to.
<b>Artistic</b>	Having or revealing a natural creative skill.
<b>Assembling</b>	Construct / build / fit together the separate parts of a machine or other object. Example: Toys with "some assembly required".

<b>Attitude</b>	The way a person feels about something or someone, or a particular feeling or opinion.
<b>Auditory Learning</b>	A learning style in which people learn most effectively by listening.
<b>Be Your Own Boss</b>	Being an entrepreneur and owning one's own business.
<b>Benefits Package</b>	Extra perks or rewards like pension or medical insurance, that an employer provides in addition to salary.
<b>Budgeting</b>	A budget is a calculation plan, usually but not always financial, for a defined period, often one year or a month.
<b>Build Mutually Beneficial Relationships</b>	Working with others to build partnerships and connections that benefit both parties.
<b>Calm</b>	Peaceful, quiet, and without worry.
<b>Caring</b>	Feeling or showing kindness and concern for others.
<b>Challenging Work</b>	Work that requires physical or mental skill to complete.
<b>Clean Workspace</b>	A place to work free of clutter, dirt and or debris.
<b>Cearly Defined Duties</b>	The employer provides good explanations of what one's job duties are and instructions on how to do them.
<b>Client-Centered</b>	To be focused on the needs of the client and understand their point of view.
<b>College</b>	An educational institution or establishment that students may attend after high school. Examples are NBCC and CCNB.
<b>Compassionate</b>	Feeling or showing sympathy and concern for others.

<b>Competitive</b>	Having or displaying a strong desire to be more successful than others.
<b>Computer Coding</b>	The process to writing instructions using a programming language (HTML) for a computer to perform a task. Computer Coding is a step within computer programming.
<b>Computer Program Testing</b>	It is a method of executing a software program with the goal of testing program behavior and finding errors.
<b>Confidence</b>	The feeling or belief that one can rely on someone (including themselves) or something. A form of trust.
<b>Conflict Resolution</b>	A process that two or more parties use to find a peaceful solution to their dispute.
<b>Conserve Natural Resources</b>	Not wasting things that naturally occur in the world and support life. This includes things like land, trees, water and wildlife.
<b>Constant Change</b>	Nothing stays the same and new things are happening all the time.
<b>Constructive Feedback</b>	When someone offers advice that is focussed on improvement and being helpful and not intended to make someone feel bad.
<b>Content Management</b>	Is the process of collecting, organizing and managing information.
<b>Cooking Skills</b>	Abilities that allow a person to prepare food effectively and safely.
<b>Coping Skills</b>	These are the thoughts and behaviors that one engages in to help manage distressing situations.
<b>Courageous</b>	Facing a difficult, frightening or even dangerous situation even though the person is afraid.

<b>Create Cutting-Edge Technology</b>	Inventing the most advanced version of a product or service. Using technology in ways that no one else has thought of doing.
<b>Create New Ideas</b>	Find new ways to solve a problem, make things better or have a unique thought.
<b>Create Something New</b>	To bring something into being something that did not exist before you thought of it.
<b>Creative Freedom</b>	The ability to come up with new ideas, test them and develop new things without pressure or criticism from others.
<b>Creatively Solve a Problem</b>	To develop a solution to a problem in a unique way that no one else has thought of before.
<b>Creativity</b>	The use of the imagination or original ideas, especially in the production of an artistic work.
<b>Crisis Intervention</b>	Short-term techniques designed to reduce potential permanent damage to an individual affected by a crisis.
<b>Critical Thinking</b>	The objective analysis and evaluation of an issue in order to form a judgment. Using facts and logic to make a decision.
<b>Cultural Background</b>	The ethnic, religious, racial, gender, linguistic or other socio- economic factors and values that shape an individual's upbringing.
<b>Curiosity</b>	A strong desire to know or learn something.
<b>Dangerous</b>	Able or likely to cause harm or injury.
<b>Data Analysis</b>	The process of applying statistical and/or logical techniques to describe, condense, recap, and evaluate data.
<b>Database Management</b>	Allows a person to organize, store, and retrieve data from a computer.

<b>Data Entry</b>	The input of data or information into a computer using input devices, such as a keyboard.
<b>Day Shifts</b>	A work schedule that runs within the usual daylight hours.
<b>Decisive</b>	Having or showing the ability to make decisions quickly and effectively.
<b>Dedicated</b>	Devoted to a task or purpose; having single-minded loyalty or integrity.
<b>Degrees and Certifications</b>	A title one receives from an educational institution to show completion of a field of study.
<b>Delegation</b>	The act of asking, directing or appointing someone to complete a task.
<b>Dependable</b>	Trustworthy and reliable.
<b>Detail-Oriented</b>	Being able to concentrate on the details of a project, assignment or task at hand. Often times, this means spotting errors or inconsistencies.
<b>Develop Software</b>	The process of designing, creating, testing, and maintaining different computer programs or applications to operate technology.
<b>Digital Photo Editing</b>	Using computer software to edit, manipulate, and fix digital photos for the purposes of marketing, promotion and artistic endeavors.
<b>Dirty Workspace</b>	A work environment that may be unclean due to contamination, garbage, or using materials that are messy to work with.
<b>Document Use</b>	Reading and following instructions on paper or digital documents.

<b>Duties Not Clearly Defined</b>	Being required to do work with little instruction or guidance.
<b>Efficient</b>	Achieving maximum productivity with minimum wasted effort or expense.
<b>Emotional Intelligence</b>	The capacity to be aware of, control, and express one's emotions, and to handle interpersonal relationships effectively.
<b>Emotionally Demanding</b>	When we feel tired and become less able to control our emotions effectively due to the stress from other people or things.
<b>Empathetic</b>	Showing an ability to understand and share the feelings of another.
<b>Enjoy Technology</b>	Like to work with computers and other devices that are highly technical in nature.
<b>Enjoy the Work That You Do</b>	When the work that you do doesn't feel like work and you would do these activities even if you weren't getting paid.
<b>Entertain People</b>	Doing things to make people laugh and have fun.
<b>Enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval.
<b>Ethical</b>	Doing things that are consistent with your beliefs and values. Doing things that are viewed as morally acceptable by others.
<b>Experiential Learning</b>	Simply means "learning by doing".
<b>Exposure to Health Risks</b>	A work environment that may contain things that could be harmful or dangerous.
<b>Exposure to Heat or Cold</b>	A work environment that may operate on one (or both) extremes of being very hot or very cold.

<b>Exposure to Noise</b>	Equipment to protect one's hearing may be required because of it being a very noisy environment.
<b>Extroverted</b>	Outgoing and socially confident. It may also mean that one has more energy being around others and in busy, noisy environments.
<b>Fair</b>	In accordance with the rules, standards or what is considered morally correct or just.
<b>Fashionable</b>	Dressing or behaving according to the current trend. Having a sense of style.
<b>Fast-Paced Environment</b>	A work environment where tasks are completed quickly, decisions are made quickly and efficiency is a main goal.
<b>Fight Injustice</b>	Having a strong sense of moral values and beliefs and a willingness to intervene when an act of injustice occurs.
<b>Fight Poverty</b>	Making a conscious effort to do things and/or help others for the purpose of putting an end to people living in poverty.
<b>Financial Bonuses</b>	Monetary rewards that employers may use when staff exceed certain objectives or sales targets.
<b>Financial Incentives</b>	Monetary encouragement that employers may use to motivate staff to reach certain objectives, sales targets or attract skilled labour.
<b>Financial Literacy</b>	Financial literacy is the ability to understand and effectively use various financial skills, including personal financial management, budgeting, and investing.
<b>Financial Management</b>	Financial Management means planning, organizing, directing and controlling the financial activities such as procurement and utilization of funds of a business.

<b>First Aid</b>	Help given to a sick or injured person until full medical treatment is available.
<b>Fix the System</b>	Advocating for and leading change in systems of government and society as a whole.
<b>Flexible</b>	Being ready and able to change so as to adapt to different circumstances.
<b>Flexible Work Schedule</b>	As long as the work is being done, an employer may allow employees to be less structured on when they work.
<b>Flexible Work Week</b>	The days required in the office vs working from home or days required working could change from week to week.
<b>Focused</b>	To pay attention to something without becoming distracted.
<b>Frequent Travel</b>	Often moving from location to location for work.
<b>Friendly</b>	To be kind and pleasant.
<b>Frontline</b>	Interacting with customers and/or clients to deliver products and services. Often the frontline workers are the "faces" of organizations.
<b>Fun Work Environment</b>	Working in an environment that is enjoyable a person has fun with their colleagues and customers/clients.
<b>Generous</b>	Giving more of something than is strictly necessary or expected.
<b>Genuine</b>	Truly what something is said to be. Authentic.
<b>Goal Setting and Planning</b>	The ability to identify goals (objectives) and effectively develop strategies on how to work towards and obtain those goals.



<b>Good Communicator</b>	Ability to express oneself clearly so others can understand the information that is being shared. Often requires good listening skills.
<b>Good Judgment</b>	Making smart, perceptive, and insightful decisions and observations.
<b>Good Listener</b>	The ability to listen and understand what other people are communicating. It is part of being a good communicator.
<b>Graduate High School</b>	An academic achievement that is seen as a minimum requirement in today's workforce.
<b>Graphic Design</b>	The art or skill of combining text and pictures in advertisements, magazines, books or electronic media.
<b>Hand-Eye Coordination</b>	Is the ability to do activities that require the simultaneous use of our hands and eyes.
<b>Hands-On Work</b>	Involves actually doing a particular thing, rather than just talking about it or getting someone else to do it.
<b>Hard Working</b>	Tending to work with energy and commitment.
<b>Heavy Workload</b>	Having a lot of work to do with many deadlines and not a lot of time to complete all the tasks required. Very busy.
<b>Help Customers</b>	Assisting people who visit a place of business by providing information, answering questions and/or helping them find a product or service.
<b>Help the Less Fortunate</b>	Assisting people in need by providing them with things like food, money , clothing or shelter.
<b>Help Your Community</b>	Identifying problems and working to find solutions to address those problems within the community you live in.

<b>Help Your Country</b>	Typically associated with public service like working in government or military service.
<b>High Stakes</b>	A risky endeavour or activity with high chance of failure or negative consequences but has a huge payoff if successful.
<b>High Stress Environment</b>	An environment that places many physical, mental, emotional or other factors on a person that can be harmful over time.
<b>Honest</b>	To be free of deceit and untruthfulness. Sincere.
<b>Humility</b>	A modest or low view of one's own importance. Humbleness.
<b>Hygiene</b>	Conditions or practices conducive to maintaining health and preventing disease, especially through cleanliness.
<b>Improve Lives</b>	Actions that make someone else's live better.
<b>Improvisation</b>	Something that is improvised, especially a piece of music, drama, etc., created without preparation. Something "made up on the spot".
<b>Independent Learning</b>	The process where learners have ownership and control of their learning.
<b>Inquisitive</b>	Curious or inquiring. Being inclined to ask questions.
<b>Influential</b>	Having great influence on someone or something. Effecting how something works, reacts or how someone may think or act.
<b>Innovative</b>	Introducing new ideas; original and creative in thinking.
<b>Insightful</b>	Having or showing an accurate and deep understanding or perspective.

<b>Installation</b>	The action or process of installing something. Adding something to an existing place or thing that did not exist before.
<b>Integrity</b>	The quality of being honest and having strong moral principles.
<b>Internet Skills</b>	The ability to access, use and navigate the internet to obtain or supply information.
<b>Interpersonal Skills</b>	The ability to communicate or interact well with other people.
<b>Introverted</b>	Reserved and comfortable spending time alone. It may also mean that one has more energy after being around others by having time to oneself and a quiet place to reflect.
<b>Intuitive</b>	Using or based on what one feels to be true even without conscious reasoning. Instinctive.
<b>Inventive</b>	Having the ability to create or design new things or to think originally.
<b>Job Search</b>	Having the ability to know where jobs are posted and having the proper marketing tools (resume, interview skills) to effectively secure employment.
<b>Job Security</b>	Having confidence that one's job is unlikely to be taken away from them.
<b>Kind</b>	The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate.
<b>Leadership</b>	The action of leading (directing the actions) of a group of people or an organization.
<b>Learn New Things</b>	The desire to gain more information about oneself and the world around them.

<b>Legal Knowledge</b>	Understand how the justice system works. To understand one's rights and responsibilities according to the law.
<b>Life-Long Learner</b>	An understanding and acceptance that people can always learn new things at any age. A desire to keep learning.
<b>Love of Food</b>	Enjoying every aspect of food. Eating, preparing and exploring new food and ways to eat.
<b>Low Stress Environment</b>	Minimal to no negative influences impacting a person in their work or personal space.
<b>Manage Money</b>	This involves budgeting, saving, investing, spending, and/or overseeing how others use their money.
<b>Manage Payroll</b>	Ensuring people are paid accurately and on time. Related to accounting and management.
<b>Mathematics</b>	The abstract science of number, quantity, and space. Mathematics may be studied in its own right or applied to other technical fields.
<b>Marketing</b>	The activity or business of promoting and selling products or services, including market research and advertising.
<b>Meeting New People</b>	Actively connecting with people that a person has not met before.
<b>Mentorship</b>	The guidance provided by a mentor, especially an experienced person in a company or educational institution.
<b>Minima Supervision</b>	An expectation that a person can work independently with little interaction from a boss or supervisor.
<b>Multilingual</b>	The ability to comprehend and communicate in more than one language.

<b>Multi-Skilled</b>	Having more than one (or many) skills or abilities.
<b>Must Wear a Uniform</b>	An employer may require employees to wear a standard uniform for protection, identification (or both).
<b>Natural Skills and Talents</b>	Abilities that a person is born with that do not require extra training or provides an advantage over someone without the same skills and talents.
<b>Need Protective Gear</b>	Working in an environment that requires protective equipment to keep a person safe and/or limiting the possibility of injury.
<b>Negotiation</b>	The process of discussing something with someone in order to reach an agreement with them.
<b>Networking</b>	The action or process of interacting with others to exchange information and develop professional or social contacts.
<b>Night Shifts</b>	A work schedule that runs within the evening or overnight hours.
<b>Non-Financial Incentives</b>	Encouragement that employers may use to motivate staff to reach certain objectives, sales targets or attract skilled labour that don't involve money. Things like extra vacation, flexible schedules, etc.
<b>Non-Verbal Communication / Body Language</b>	Ways in which ones body reacts or moves to emphasize things they are say (hand gestures) or convey emotions like blushing when embarrassed.
<b>Numeracy</b>	The ability to understand and work with numbers.

<b>Objective</b>	To rely more on facts and logic when trying to understand a situation and relying less so on thoughts or feelings.
<b>On-the-Job Training</b>	Where no prior knowledge of how to do a job is required and it is learned by being taught how to do the job at the work site.
<b>On Your Feet All Day</b>	The job requires a person to stand or move around all day with no time to sit down.
<b>Open-Minded</b>	To be willing to accept other points of view, opinions and other solutions to problems. Accepting of many possibilities.
<b>Opinionated</b>	To have strong conviction or to be very sure that one's own opinions or perspective is the correct one.
<b>Optimistic</b>	Hopeful and confident about the future.
<b>Oral Communication</b>	The ability to express oneself verbally and the information that is conveyed be understood by those listening.
<b>Organized</b>	To have things arranged in a systematic way.
<b>Overtime is Common</b>	An employee may have to work additional hours on a frequent basis.
<b>Passionate</b>	Showing strong feelings or a strong belief.
<b>Patience</b>	The ability to accept or tolerate delay, trouble, or suffering without getting angry or upset.
<b>Pension</b>	A regular payment made during a person's retirement from an investment fund to which that person or their employer has contributed during their working life.
<b>Perfectionist</b>	A person who refuses to accept any standard short of perfection. An expectation that things need to be done perfectly.

<b>Persistent</b>	Continuing firmly or obstinately in a course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition.
<b>Personal Identity</b>	Self image. How a person sees themselves as a separate individual being with a distinctive personality.
<b>Personal Values and Beliefs</b>	Values are the principles and standards upon which we lead our lives. Beliefs are things in life that one feels strongly about, that guide them in their daily life.
<b>Physical Fitness</b>	A state of well-being in which performance is optimal. Is a combination of balance, co-ordination, agility, speed , power, and reaction time.
<b>Physically Demanding Tasks</b>	Something that requires a lot of one's time, energy and attention. Is physically difficult.
<b>Planning</b>	The process of making plans for something. Setting goals and figuring out a way to achieve them.
<b>Positive Mental Health</b>	When a person feels optimistic and happy. They are confident that are able to cope with stress and hard times.
<b>Positive Work Environment</b>	When a person feels supported by their colleagues and that they are able to achieve the work they are tasked to do successfully.
<b>Practice Skills</b>	Repeated performance of skills so as to acquire or maintain proficiency in them.
<b>Predict Outcomes</b>	To say or estimate that (a specified thing) will happen in the future or will be a consequence of something.
<b>Prevent Incidents, Illnesses and Injuries</b>	The act of being proactive and preventing harm by seeing problems and potential dangers and correcting them before someone gets hurt.

<b>Prioritization</b>	The action or process of deciding the relative importance or urgency of a thing or things.
<b>Private Training School</b>	A post-secondary school that provides specialized training and is not funded by the government.
<b>Proactive</b>	Creating or controlling a situation by causing something to happen rather than responding to it after it has happened.
<b>Process Improvement</b>	Is a process within project management of analyzing how things work and finding ways to make them work better or more efficiently.
<b>Product Development</b>	The process of thinking about a product, creating it and bringing to customers to be sold.
<b>Professional</b>	Worthy of or appropriate to a professional person; competent, skillful, or assured. A person who serves as a positive example of how one should act within their occupation.
<b>Project Management</b>	The process of overseeing a project from its creation until it is completed and has the desired outcomes.
<b>Protect Others</b>	Doing things that keep others from danger or harm.
<b>Provide Legal Support</b>	Helping someone navigate the legal or justice system so their rights are protected.
<b>Punctual</b>	To be on time or to arrive at a place when one says they will be there.
<b>Quality Control</b>	Ensuring a product or service meets an acceptable standard set by a company or expected by customers/clients.
<b>Quiet</b>	The absence of sound or noise. A person who does not make much noise or talk very much.



<b>Quoting Costs</b>	Estimating how much a product or service might cost before the job is complete or product is delivered to the customer.
<b>Reading Skills</b>	The process of looking at written symbols and letters and understanding the meaning of them.
<b>Recognition</b>	Identification of someone or something or person from previous encounters or knowledge.
<b>Record Keeping</b>	Tracking dates, times and events and organizing them in a way that they can be referenced at a later date.
<b>Recruit and Hire People</b>	Methods used to attract people who have the skills needed for a business and providing money and incentives so they agree to there.
<b>Red Seal</b>	A designation for many of the skilled trades that allows tradespeople to work provincially or nationally without requiring more training.
<b>Repetitive Tasks</b>	Performing the same activity over and over again often for extended periods of time.
<b>Reporting</b>	Give a spoken or written account of something that one has observed, heard, done, or investigated.
<b>Research</b>	The systematic investigation into and study of materials and sources in order to establish facts and reach new conclusions.
<b>Resilient</b>	The ability to be happy, successful and thrive after difficult life events. Strong. Survivor.
<b>Resource Management</b>	Understanding the things a person has to survive or a business has to operate and making sure those things (resources) do not run out. Money, time, and food are examples of resources.

<b>Resourcefulness</b>	The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties.
<b>Respectful</b>	Feeling respect or showing politeness.
<b>Responsible</b>	Having an obligation to do something, or having control over or care for someone, as part of one's job or role.
<b>Results-Driven</b>	Placing most of the value in ones actions into the outcomes it produces.
<b>Risk Management</b>	It is a form of business management to predict where a business might loose money and find ways to lessen or eliminate those risks.
<b>Routine</b>	A sequence of actions regularly followed. A fixed program.
<b>Safety</b>	The condition of being protected from or unlikely to cause danger, risk, or injury.
<b>Sales</b>	The exchange of a commodity for money.
<b>Save Lives and Property</b>	Protecting others and their belongings from harm, damage and/or loss.
<b>Save the Planet</b>	Actions that contribute to the earth remaining a healthy and viable place to live.
<b>Schedule Meetings</b>	Set times and places for people to meet and communicate the meeting times and places for those invited to attend.
<b>Science</b>	The systematic study of the structure and behavior of the natural and physical world.
<b>Search for New Opportunities</b>	Talking to employers and looking for job postings for opportunities that may be of interest.

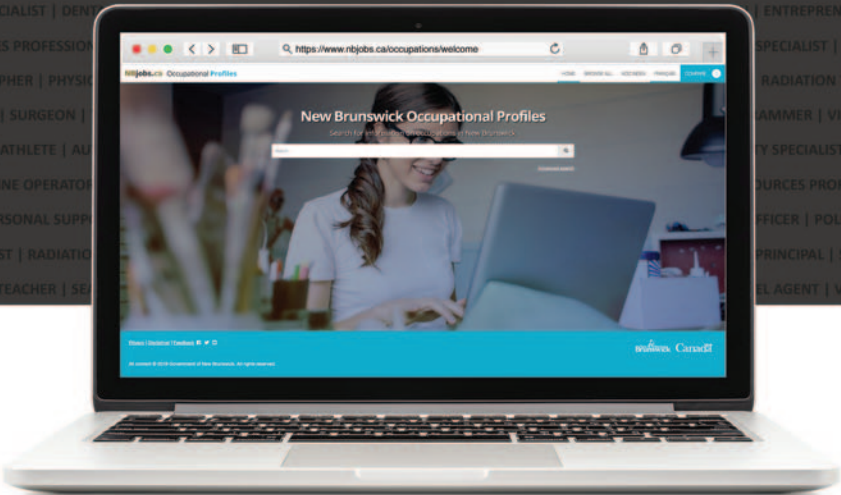
<b>See Problems as Opportunities</b>	The ability to reframe what seems to be a problem into an opportunity to learn or to turn to it into a competitive advantage.
<b>Self-Control</b>	The ability to control oneself, in particular one's emotions and desires or the expression of them in one's behavior, especially in difficult situations.
<b>Self-Esteem</b>	Confidence in one's own worth or abilities.
<b>Self-Improvement</b>	The improvement of one's knowledge, status, or character by one's own efforts.
<b>Self-Motivated</b>	The ambition to do or achieve something because of one's own enthusiasm or interest, without needing pressure from others.
<b>Sitting for Long Periods of Time</b>	A job or work environment may require a person to sit for most of the working day.
<b>Skilled Trade</b>	A career path that requires hands-on work, and specialty knowledge and training.
<b>Small, Confined Spaces</b>	A work environment that may require a person to crawl into small or difficult places to repair, retrieve something or rescue something.
<b>Smelly</b>	An unpleasant or noxious smell.
<b>Sociable</b>	Friendly, outgoing and willing to make friends.
<b>Social Status</b>	A person's standing or importance in relation to other people within a society.
<b>Socially Conscious Organization</b>	An organization realizes that their products and services should be developed with sustainability and corporate social responsibility in mind.
<b>Steady Workflow</b>	When work proceeds at a pace that is comfortable for a person to complete tasks and there are no periods of waiting around with nothing to do.

<b>Stress Management</b>	A method of limiting stress and its effects by learning ways of behaving and thinking that reduce it.
<b>Supporting Others</b>	To give aid or encouragement to a person or cause.
<b>Take Initiative</b>	Thinking proactively about task. Taking action to complete a task or accomplish a goal without someone requesting it.
<b>Task Oriented</b>	To be focused on completing a task that one is working on. Valuing the action of doing the task rather than planning or discussing it.
<b>Teaching</b>	Ideas or principles taught by an authority. To provide instruction and support someone in the learning process.
<b>Things Stay the Same</b>	The same routine every day where things don't change or vary much.
<b>Time Management</b>	The ability to use one's time effectively or productively, especially at work.
<b>Transferable Skills</b>	Abilities or talents relevant to many professions and facets of life.
<b>Trustworthy</b>	Able to be relied on as honest or truthful.
<b>Typing</b>	The action or skill of writing something by means of a cell phone or computer.
<b>Understand How Things Work</b>	To be curious and want to learn about how the world around us operates.
<b>Understand Medical Terminology</b>	To be able to understand the terms and descriptions of the human body and how it functions.
<b>Unique Office Space</b>	To work in an office environment or location that is not like a typical place that most people work.

<b>University</b>	An educational institution designed for instruction, examination, or both. Students can obtain degrees in specialized fields of study.
<b>Use Facts and Numbers</b>	Using information that can be measured, collected and analyzed objectively. Scientific and business fields rely heavily on this.
<b>Using Machinery</b>	Operating machinery to complete work tasks.
<b>Using Your Hands</b>	Using one's hands to complete a task.
<b>Visual Learning</b>	Learning how to do something by watching someone else demonstrate how it is done. Reading is also visual learning.
<b>Work by Yourself</b>	To work alone to complete a task or obtain an objective.
<b>Work-Life Balance</b>	To establish time to do work and time to rest or pursue personal goals in an even or balanced way.
<b>Work as a Team</b>	To work and cooperate with others to complete a task or obtain an objective.
<b>Work in Difficult Workplaces</b>	Working in environments that might be stressful, potentially dangerous or challenging mentally or physically.
<b>Work in an Office Setting</b>	To travel to a place to work (typically an office building) to work with others.
<b>Work Independently</b>	To work on your own either as a business owner or to be solely responsible for the work that is done.
<b>Work Long Hours</b>	Being required to work longer than people typically do in a work day.
<b>Work Outside</b>	Working outdoors and not in an office setting.

<b>Work Remotely</b>	The ability to work from home or a location outside the office to complete work tasks.
<b>Work with Animals</b>	Being responsible for the care and well-being of animals that a person is tasked to do as part of their job.
<b>Work with Children and Youth</b>	Being responsible for the care and well-being of young people that a person is tasked to do as part of their job.
<b>Work with Difficult People</b>	Having to work with people who may not want to work with others.
<b>Work with Newcomers</b>	Help and support people who have just moved here from another country.
<b>Work with Others</b>	The ability to engage and cooperate with other people to accomplish a task.
<b>Work with People with Special Needs</b>	Help and support people who have learning barriers and/or disabilities.
<b>Work with Social Media</b>	The ability to understand how social media works to produce engaging content and attract/influence users.
<b>Work with the Elderly</b>	Help and support people who are older (senior citizens).
<b>Work with Tools</b>	Using a tool specifically designed to assist in the successful completion of a task. Knowing how to use it effectively and safely.
<b>Writing Skills</b>	The ability to communicate or provide information through a written medium like a book, blog or texting.
