Plan, design and implement information systems and procedures; analyze the quality of software and systems; assess software and system security risks and investigate security breaches.



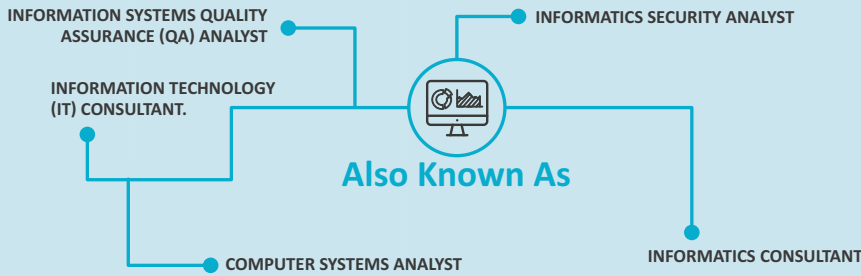

Research, design, evaluate, integrate and maintain software applications, technical environments, operating systems, embedded software, information warehouses and telecommunications software.



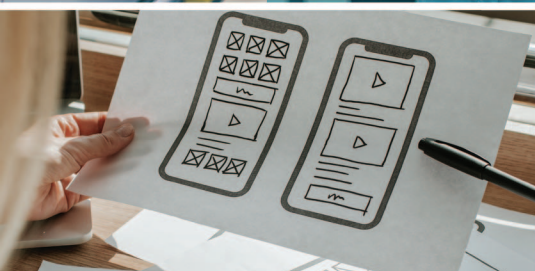
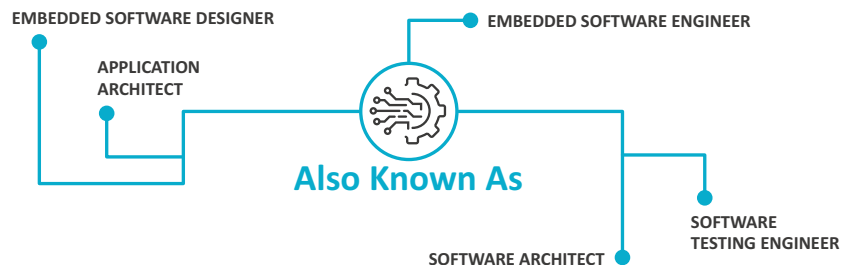

Write, modify and test computer code for application-level and operating systems-level software, or for interactive media, such as games, e-learning, and mobile applications.



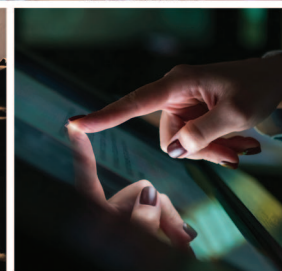
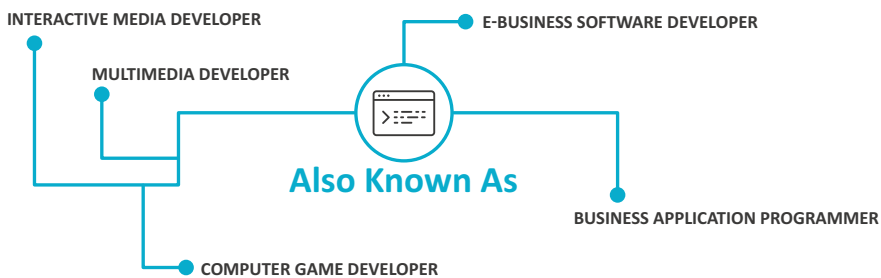

Design, develop and maintain database management systems. Data administrators develop and implement data administration policy, standards and models.



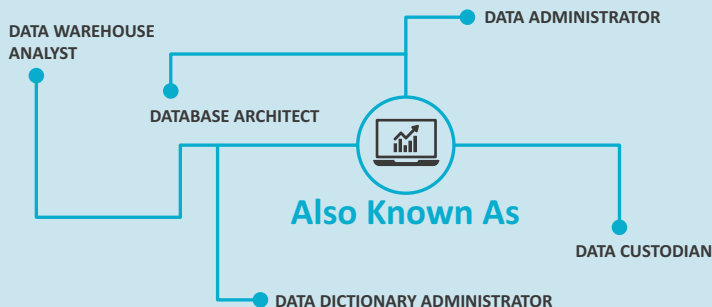

User support technicians provide technical support to users experiencing difficulties with computer hardware, computer applications and communications software.



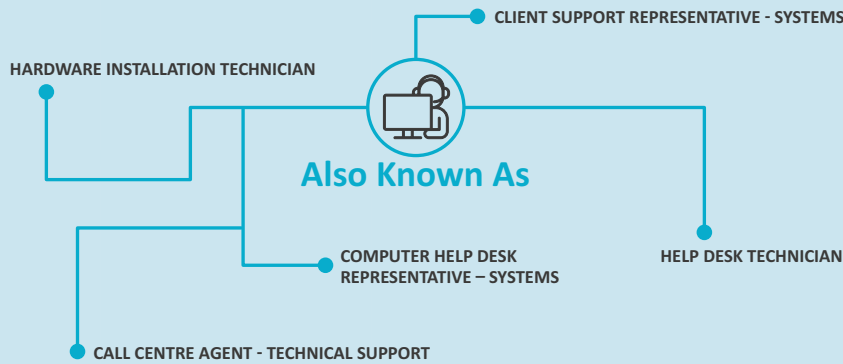

Perform detailed system tests, produce reports and develop new system architectures. They also translate the strategic objectives of a company into tasks for information technology departments.



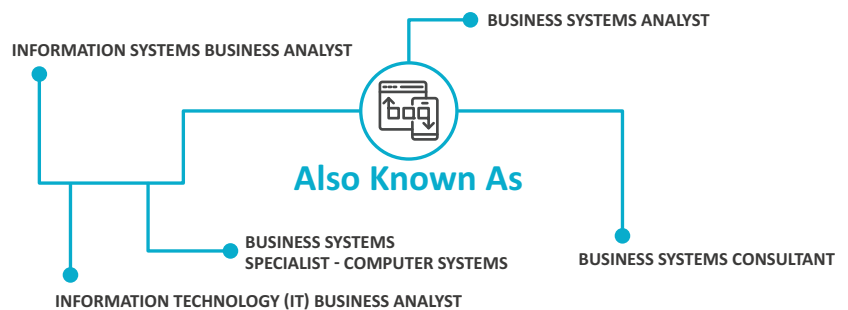
