## **Sector Definition**

The Manufacturing sector consists of establishments that are primarily engaged in the chemical, mechanical or physical transformation of materials or substances into new products. These products may be finished and ready to be used or consumed, or semi-finished, becoming a raw material for use in further manufacturing. Manufacturing establishments include a variety of trade designations, such as plants, factories or mills. Certain activities involving the transformation of goods are classified in other sectors.

The scope of this profile includes North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2017) sectors 31-33.

## **GDP\*** and **Productivity**


#### In 2018:

- The Manufacturing sector represented 10.7% of New Brunswick's (NB) GDP, contributing \$3.0 billion (chained 2012 dollars)<sup>1, 2</sup>
- NB Labour Productivity<sup>2, 3</sup> (a measure of productivity based on GDP per hour worked in the sector):
  - This sector \$51.18 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)
  - Average of all sectors \$47.57 output per hour of work (chained 2012 dollars)

## **Employment in New Brunswick**

#### In 2018:

- 31,300 were employed in the NB Manufacturing sector (98.1% full-time, 1.9% part-time)<sup>4</sup>
- 3,200 were unemployed<sup>4</sup>
- 8.8% of all employed in NB worked in this sector<sup>4</sup>
- 22.8% of employees in this NB sector were part of a union and/or covered by a collective agreement – versus 29.8% of all employees in the Province<sup>5</sup>



NB Unemployment Rate: 2018<sup>4</sup> Manufacturing Sector vs All Sectors






# **Employment: 2009-2018<sup>6</sup> NB Manufacturing Sector**

## **Human Resources Profile**

## **Demographics**

#### In 2018:

 34,500 people were part of the labour force in the NB Manufacturing sector, of which 31,300 were employed<sup>4</sup>

#### From 2009 to 2018:

- The percentage of females employed in the sector decreased from 27.5% to 23.6%<sup>4</sup>
- The percentage of workers employed in this sector:4
  - Ages 15-24 increased 0.1 percentage points
  - Ages 25-54 decreased 6.6 percentage points
  - Ages 55 and over increased 6.6 percentage points

## **Major Occupations**

In 2018:

- 20.5% of those working in the NB Manufacturing sector worked in one of the five National Occupation Code (NOC) occupations listed in the table to the right<sup>8</sup>
- These 6,500 employees represented 1.8% of all employed in NB<sup>8</sup>



## **Wage and Salary Information**


In 2018:

 The average wage in the NB Manufacturing sector (\$23.35) was greater than the average NB wage across all sectors (\$22.89)<sup>9</sup>


From 2009 to 2018:

• The relative change in the sector's average wage (+26.2%) was greater than the relative change in the average NB wage across all sectors (+22.4%)<sup>9</sup>



(Relative to 2018)


